One accomplishment that Richie is most proud of is his bachelor's degree in economics from Tuskegee University. "Normally, the titles career musician and college graduate are mutually exclusive, but they're not for me," he laughs. For anyone who didn't know, Lionel Richie was the recipient of an honorary degree in music from Boston College in 1986.

Having led more than 1,900 Boston Pops concerts, Keith Lockhart has collaborated with artists—both established performers and rising stars—from virtually every corner of the entertainment world. Holder of the Julian and Eunice Cohen Boston Pops Conductor chair, Lockhart has led the Pops for 24 years. In that time, he has made nearly 80 television shows, led 43 national and four overseas tours with the Boston Pops Esplanade Orchestra, led the Pops at several high-profile sports events, and recorded 14 albums. Lockhart's tenure has been marked by a dramatic increase in touring, the orchestra's first Grammy nominations, the first major network national broadcast of the Fourth of July spectacular from the Esplanade, and the release of the Boston Pops' first selfproduced and self-distributed recordings. Boston College is thrilled to welcome the Pops back to the Heights for this 26th anniversary gala. Attendees can expect yet another magical performance from "America's Orchestra."

The Boston Pops is the most recorded and arguably the most beloved orchestra in the country. With the 125th anniversary season in 2010, the Boston Pops reached a landmark moment in a remarkable history that began with its founding in 1885. Fours years earlier, Civil War veteran Henry Lee Higginson had founded the Boston Symphony Orchestra, calling its establishment "the dream of my life." From the start he intended to present, in the warmer months, concerts of light classics and the popular music of the day. From a practical perspective, Higginson realized that these "lighter" performances would provide year-round employment for his musicians. The "Promenade Concerts," as they were originally called, were soon informally known as "Popular Concerts," which eventually became shortened to "Pops," the name officially adopted in 1900.

Inder the direction of John Finney, the University Chorale is a mixed chorus of 150–160 singers and performs both classical and contemporary chorale literature. The chorale presents several concerts each year, including the ever-popular Christmas Concert with the Boston College Symphony Orchestra, and also travels abroad for a concert tour during spring break in March. Recent destinations have included Italy, the Czech Republic, Ireland, Germany, and Spain.



With over 180 members, the "Screaming Eagles" Marching Band is the largest and most visible student organization at Boston College. Founded in 1919, the Eagles band has traveled around the world to represent Boston College at football games, parades, and international celebrations. In addition to numerous domestic bowl game appearances, the band has performed at the Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade; the Japan Bowl in Yokohama, Japan; the second inauguration of President Barack Obama; and the Emerald Isle Classic in Dublin, Ireland.

THE CLEARY LEGACY

In Tribute





eeply passionate about philanthropy, higher education, and the arts, the late Barbara and James F. Cleary '50, H'93, founded the annual Pops on the Heights BC scholarship gala in 1993. Jim—a BC Trustee and founder of the Fides and President's Circle annual giving societies—and Barbara worked tirelessly to help grow the event to become the University's largest annual fundraiser, which has raised \$50 million in Pops scholarships. Today, Jim and Barbara's children (Kara '84, MA'91; Kristin '89, JD'93; and Jim Jr.) continue their legacy as Pops benefactors.

In honor of the Clearys, BC has since established the annual James F. Cleary '50, H'93, P'18, Masters Award, which is given to a fundraising volunteer who exemplifies creativity, dedication, and leadership.
